

ORDINANCE NO. 22-002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DIXON ADOPTING CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 21601 ET SEQ. AND DIXON MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 2.12.020, SUBDIVISION (C)

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2016 the City of Dixon City Council (the "City") adopted Ordinance No. 16-007 to establish that the election of City Councilmembers shall be by-district with the Mayor elected at-large; and

WHEREAS, the FAIR MAPS Act (Elec. Code, § 21600 et seq.) (the "Act") and Dixon Municipal Code section 2.12.020, subdivision (c), requires the City to readjust City Council district boundaries following each federal decennial census so that the City Council districts are substantially equal in population; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires the City to readjust the City Council district boundaries based on following factors: (1) geographic contiguous; (2) minimize divisions of neighborhoods and "communities of interest;" (3) easily identifiable boundaries; and (4) compact; and

WHEREAS, the City has retained an experienced demographer consulting firm, National Demographics Corporation, to advise it on the process of readjusting City Council district boundaries; and

WHEREAS, as required by the Act, the City conducted four (4) public hearings to receive public input on potential City Council district boundaries on: November 16, 2021; January 4, 2022; March 15, 2022, and April 5, 2022; and

WHEREAS, throughout the process, the City engaged in public outreach and engagement as required by Act; and

WHEREAS, the City has maintained a detailed redistricting website as required by the Act, <https://redrawdixon.org/>; and

WHEREAS, the City has provided notices and live translation services upon request, as required by the Act; and

WHEREAS, the City made available to the public tools to permit the public to submit draft maps and testimony in writing or electronically, if desired; and

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WHEREAS, the City Council believes that the City Council district boundaries contained in the map attached to this Ordinance as "Exhibit A" are in the best interest of the City and compliant with all applicable provisions of State law.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DIXON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The map attached hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein, is hereby adopted and shall constitute the City Council district boundaries for the City for use at the City's November 2022 election and subsequent elections until further re-alignment pursuant to State law and Dixon Municipal Code section 2.12.020, subdivision (c).

SECTION 2. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance, and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase not declared invalid or unconstitutional, without regard to whether any portion of the Ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage by the City Council, and following the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the City Council. Within 15 days of its adoption, a summary of the ordinance shall be published in The Dixon Tribune, a newspaper of general circulation, circulated and published in the City of Dixon, State of California, which summary shall include the names of those Councilmembers voting for and against the ordinance. A certified copy of the full text of this Ordinance shall be on file in the office of the City Clerk.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk, or his or designee, shall take all actions necessary to notify the Solano County Registrar's Office of the Council's determination forthwith and provide whatever assistance may be required by the Registrar's Office to implement the new lines.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk is authorized to make non-substantive technical adjustments to the district boundaries not affecting the population of any district, the eligibility of candidates, or the residence of elected officials within any district. The City Clerk shall advise the City Council of any such technical adjustments.

SECTION 6. CERTIFICATION OF COUNCIL ADOPTION AND APPROVAL. This Ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Dixon, held on the 15th day of March, 2022 and given its first reading at said meeting Said Ordinance was given a second reading and adopted at a regular meeting of the City

Council held on the 5th day of April, 2022, and after such reading Vice Mayor Pederson moved its adoption, second by Councilmember Ernest, and said Ordinance was thereupon adopted by the following vote:

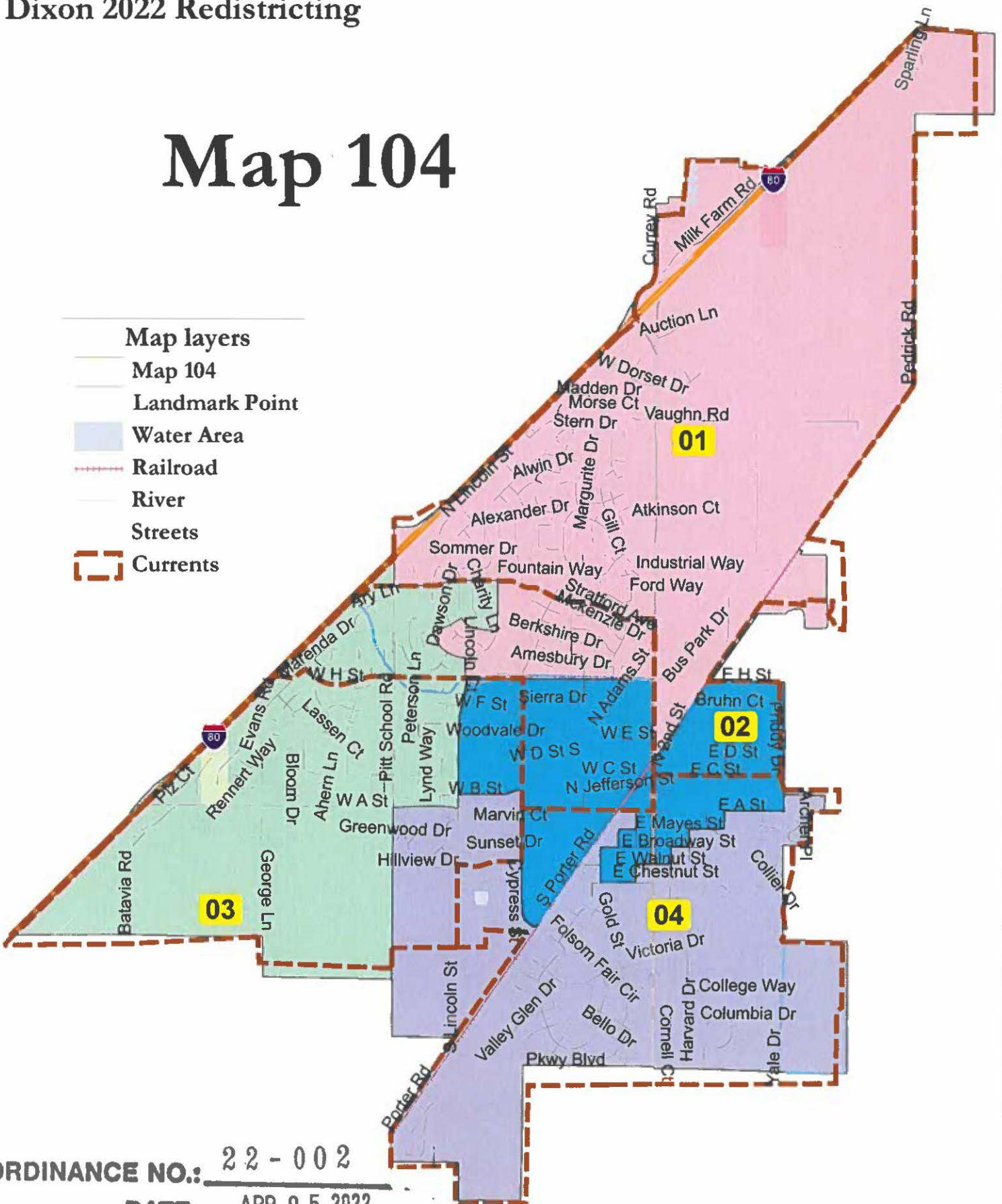
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Dixon 2022 Redistricting
