

STATE OF CALIFORNIA WATER RESTRICTIONS

The State of California has enacted Stage 2 Water Conservation Emergency Regulations. These regulations require all urban water suppliers to implement a water use reduction of 20%.

Each urban water provider has a Water Shortage Contingency Plan outlining their conservation stages and how they will meet mandated conservation levels.

CITY OF DIXON STATE MANDATED WATER SHORTAGE CONTINGENCY PLAN STAGES

Stage 1

Provide rebates, reduce water system loss, decrease line flushing, restrict runoff, prohibit use of potable water for washing surfaces, require automatic shut of hoses.

Stage 2

Limit landscape irrigation, restaurants only serve water upon request, lodging must offer opt out for linen service, restrict use of decorative water features, prohibit certain landscape irrigation.

Stage 3

Increase water compliance with regulations in stages 1 and 2.

Stage 4

Implement of modify drought rate structure, limit use of potable water for construction and dust control, prohibit vehicle washing except with recycled or recirculating water.

Stage 5

Moratorium or net zero demand increase on new connections, require covers for pools and spas, allow filling of swimming pools only when a cover is in place.

Stage 6

Prohibit all landscape irrigation.

CURRENT REGULATIONS FOR STAGE 2

ALL CUSTOMERS

- Outdoor water use is prohibited between 10am-7pm.
- Automatic shutoff nozzle is required on all hoses to prevent waste
- Reduce outdoor water use to 3 days a week
 - Odd-numbered addresses: Wednesday, Friday, Sunday
 - Even-numbered addresses: Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday
- No irrigating within 48 hours of measurable rainfall
- Repair leaks in a timely manner
- Do not allow water to runoff from landscape
- Do not use water to clean hard surfaces
- Only use decorative water features that recirculate water
- Reduce water use by 10%



BUSINESSES

- New state regulation bans irrigating turf at commercial, industrial and institutional properties, such as grass in front of or next to large buildings. It does not include turf that is used for recreation, community purpose, or to maintain trees
- Drinking water may only be served upon request in all eating or drinking establishment
- Lodging must offer opt out for linen service and display this notice

HOW CAN THE CITY HELP?

- City Water Operators are reducing system loss/decreasing line flushing
- Parks in the City water system have reduced watering by 20%
